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Professor Philip Chiu is currently Professor of the Department of Surgery, Institute of Digestive Disease, Director of CUHK Jockey Club Minimal Invasive Surgical Skills Center and Assistant Dean (External Affairs), Faculty of Medicine, The Chinese University of Hong Kong. Professor Chiu graduated from the Faculty of Medicine, Chinese University of Hong Kong in 1994 with two scholarships. He became a fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh and Hong Kong Academy of Medicine in 2001. He achieved doctoral degree (M.D.) at the Chinese University of Hong Kong in 2009. Dr. Chiu was the first to perform endoscopic submucosal dissection (ESD) for treatment of early GI cancers in Hong Kong. In 2010, he performed the first Per-oral Endoscopic Myotomy (P.O.E.M.) in Hong Kong. His research interests include upper gastrointestinal bleeding, esophageal cancer and thoracoscopic esophagectomy, novel endoscopic technologies for diagnosis of early GI cancers, ESD and novel endoscopic procedures as well as Natural Orifices Transluminal Endoscopic Surgery (NOTES). Currently he is council member of the College of Surgeons of Hong Kong and deputy director of Department of Standard. He served as associate editor for Digestive Endoscopy and peer reviewer for numerous journals including Gastrointestinal Endoscopy and Endoscopy. Serving as a member of the team led by Prof. Joseph Sung, he was awarded State Scientific Technology and Progress Award by the State Council of the People's Republic of China in 2007, and 2nd class award in Technological Advancement, Ministry of Education of the People's Republic of China in 2011. Recently his research on Per Oral Endoscopic Myotomy was awarded best of DDW 2011 as well as 1st prize of the ASGE world cup of endoscopy 2012.
