



Dr. James Lau is currently Professor of Surgery at the Chinese University of Hong Kong. In 1987, he graduated from the medical school at the University of New South Wales in Australia with honors. He became a Fellow to the Royal College of Surgeons in Edinburgh in 1990. He joined the Department of Surgery of the Chinese University of Hong Kong in 1993. Dr. Lau trained with Professor Sydney Chung in therapeutic endoscopy, upper gastrointestinal and laparoscopic surgery. In year 1999, Dr. Lau became a fellow in vascular surgery at the Royal Infirmary Edinburgh. He returned to Hong Kong and led vascular surgical service at the Prince of Wales Hospital. Dr. Lau' research interests include therapeutic endoscopy and treatment of bleeding peptic ulcers. His publications led to a MD thesis in year 2001 which discussed roles of different treatment modalities in the management of bleeding peptic ulcer. Dr. Lau has published more than 10 book chapters and 100 papers in peer-reviewed international medical journals.
